Nearest Point of Relief (Definitions)

No Penalty. There is only one nearest point of relief. Must take complete relief so do not pick up the ball until certain you will take relief.

- a) Player should use the club, address position, direction of play, and swing she would have used had the obstruction not been there.
- b) Find the closest spot from where the ball lies, no closer to the hole, where you can take a stance without the condition interfering with the ball, feet, and swing. Mark that spot and then drop within one club length (longest club not including putter) of that spot, no closer to the hole.
- c) Ball may roll and stop within relief area from where it first strikes the course, no closer to the hole.
- d) If player hits dropped ball **outside** of the relief area **or** has not taken complete relief, she is hitting from wrong place, incurs two stroke penalty (see #13 above).
